Various workshops and technology seminars will focus on the many types of printed circuit board and their uses, from single-sided, double-sided, multilayer, flexible and rigid flex PCBs to PCBs with a metal core and 3D-printed circuit boards. This is what we're aiming for with Focus on PCB," says Giovelli.

A PCB serves as a mechanical mounting surface and provides electronic connections. Almost every electronic device contains one or more PCBs, which consist of an electrically insulating material and the conductive connections mounted on it.
